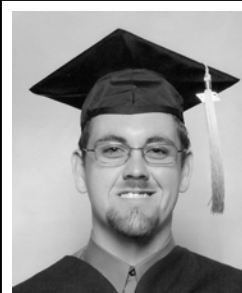
VERNON ALTMAN

DR. BILL CARR ('53)

A 1953 Cuda Graduate. Retired as Assistant Director "The Whitney Laboratory" University of Florida, and since 1998 is Professor Emeritus of Zoology, U of F. Doctor Carr holds several U. S. Patents for his inventions of artificial bait for aquatic species. This Internationally renowned scientist has participated for decades in the quest for knowledge in the areas of general biology, marine biology and ecology, to better understand the feeding behavior of popular recreational marine species. His education includes the Universities of Alabama, Stetson, Florida and Duke, where he earned his Ph D.



William E. "Bill" Hall ('63)

Began and ended his career in education serving the students of Volusia County. A graduate of the University of Florida with furthering education at Stetson University, Bill taught and coached at both NSBJH and NSBHS and was at one time assistant principal at the junior high and principal of the high school. At various junctures during his 37 year career, he served other schools in the system as well as Director of Secondary Education, Asst. Supt. Of Curriculum and Instruction, and Area Superintendent. To cap it all, Bill was appointed Superintendent of the Volusia County School System and served very successfully in that capacity for 8 years until his retirement in 2004.
